The Chicago Public Schools provides instructional support services to students who are identified as deaf or hard of hearing from ages three through twenty one. The scope of services includes child find, assessment, evaluation, placement, instruction, student and parent support services and technical assistance to local schools. The continuum of services includes consultative, itinerant, resource and instructional cluster site programs. The level of instructional/educational support is determined by the IEP team, based on the student's communication and educational needs and how those needs can best be met. A variety of communication options are utilized to meet each student's communication needs.
