The Moline D/HH Program offers 3 school sites in the Moline -Coal Valley School District: Roosevelt Elementary (preschool through 5th grade), Wilson Middle School (6th through 8th grade), and Moline High School (9th through 12th grades). The Moline-Coal Valley D/HH Program offers Deaf / HH Itinerant services, as well as services for Speech-Language, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy and Social Work needs to students with hearing loss. Eligible D/HH students from surrounding school districts are able to attend the instructional portion of the Moline D/HH program on a tuition-in basis.

If sign language interpreter services are needed for a student, they are generally provided by the student's school district as opposed to the co-op.
